Guidelines for Worship	All online.	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> All indoor worship will be in the Canterbury Chapel. The Chapel can have up to 20 people total at this phase. All will enter through the front red doors; all will exit through the back door onto the deck. Masks will be required at all times while anywhere on the property, including by the celebrant/presider during consecration. Seating is pre-positioned in a spaced-out manner and cannot be moved. Only people who live together can sit together. Everyone else must maintain 6 feet or more of social distancing at all times. Only one-time use bulletins and/or projectors (or other electronic means of distribution) used. No worship books, prayer books, or hymnals. Only pre-recorded or non-wind instrumental music. Absolutely no live singing unless it is performed by a soloist at least 20 feet from any other person (in any direction). Communion only distributed in one kind (Bread only). The distribution will be done using small serving tongs and pre-cut bread or wafers. No physical touching or physical sharing of the Peace. No physical fellowship time allowed before or after the official designated time. No food distribution allowed. 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Additional information:

- These guidelines are not exhaustive, as in this current reality it is impossible to have a fully complete plan in place. Any mandatory guidelines instituted by either the Episcopal Diocese of Arizona or the Grand Canyon Synod of the ELCA will have primacy over those listed above. Any recommended guidelines will be reviewed by the LCM|Canterbury Physical Reopening Taskforce as needed.
- The LCM|Canterbury Physical Reopening Taskforce will meet quarterly, and as needed, throughout this time. They will use both the gating requirements above and the needs of the community to determine when and how physical reopening is to occur. *Achieving all gating requirements does not necessarily mean that LCM|Canterbury will immediately move into the next phase.*
- As a campus chaplaincy/ministry is quite different from a standard parish/congregational setting, the Chaplain, Program Coordinator, and Deacon will have the responsibility of implementing and ensuring compliance of the policies listed above.
- As our Average Sunday Attendance is below 20, we will be attempting one service for Phase 2, with a hybrid online worship offering available as well. If this does not suffice, the taskforce and staff will look at offering additional services.
- Maximum occupancy of our facilities:
 - Campus Ministry Center: 49 (Phase 2 Occupancy: 12) (Phase 2.5 Occupancy: 24)
 - Canterbury Chapel: 80 (Phase 2 Occupancy: 20) (Phase 2.5 Occupancy: 40)
 - Canterbury Parish Hall: 31 (Phase 2 Occupancy: 7) (Phase 2.5 Occupancy: 15)

Our plan if a member of the campus ministry community tests positive for COVID-19:

- Anyone who tests positive within the community should alert the chaplain immediately to trigger contact tracing.
- All whom have had contact with the individual in question will be advised to begin self-isolation for 10-14 days, and to seek COVID-19 testing and medical advice.
- Both Bishops Hutterer and Reddall will be alerted immediately, as will the board presidents.
- The security cameras at Canterbury’s facility will be utilized to check for interaction with the space in question.
